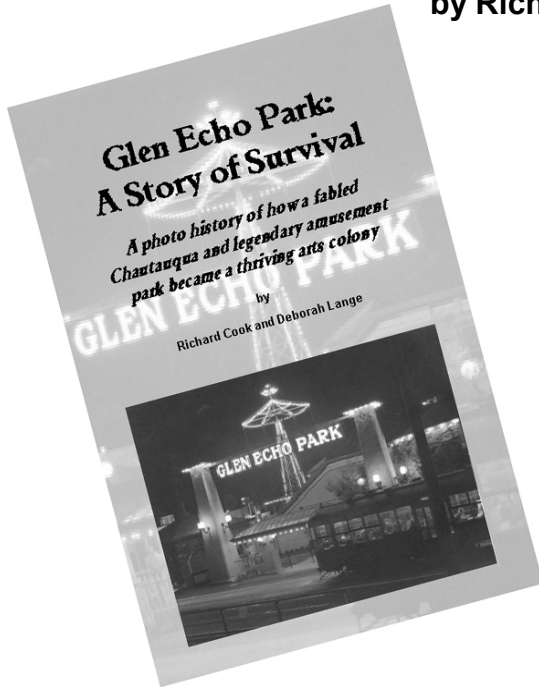


Glen Echo Park: A Story of Survival
